FLUTE CARE AND MAINTENANCE

- Wash your face and hands before playing.
- Brush your teeth before playing.
- Exercise care in removing the flute from the case. Be sure the case is upright.
- Do not leave the flute unattended outside the case.
- When you put the flute down, lay it on a soft surface with the keys facing up.
- When you return the flute to the case, dry out the inside and wipe fingerprints from the outside.
- Use one cloth for the outside and a separate cloth for the inside.
- A cotton swab dipped in alcohol may be used to clean out the embouchure hole (and the five holes in the keys of an open hole flute).
- Never touch the pads under the keys.
- Protect your flute from moisture and extreme temperatures.
- Never apply oil or cork grease to your flute.
- Never use silver polish on your flute.
- Once a year, take your flute to a technician to be cleaned, oiled and adjusted (COA).
